

ORDINANCE NO. 274

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE RAISING  
AND FEEDING OF LIVESTOCK OR POULTRY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Trustees of the Village of Greenview,  
Menard County, Illinois:

1. Where "Livestock" is hereinafter used in this Ordinance,  
the term shall include dogs and cats, as well as, usual barnyard  
livestock.

2. When the term "Poultry" is used in this Ordinance, the  
term shall mean all domestic and barnyard fowl.

3. When "Owner" is hereafter used in this Ordinance, the  
term shall include the owner of real estate, and any person re-  
gardless of whether he owns the real estate, who participates as  
an employee, or otherwise, with poultry or livestock hereafter  
defined, for commercial purposes.

4. PUBLIC POLICY. It is hereby declared a matter of public  
policy that the hatching, raising, or feeding of poultry and the  
raising or feeding of livestock for commercial purposes within the  
Village limits of Greenview, Illinois, is contrary to the interests  
of the people of this Village and the same shall constitute a  
nuisance.

5. NOTICE. An Owner violating the provisions of the public  
policy herein shall be given notice of said violation and a 15 day  
opportunity to conform with the public policy of this Village.

6. VIOLATION--PENALTY. It shall be unlawful for any Owner  
knowingly to hatch, raise, or feed poultry or raise or feed live-  
stock within the Village of Greenview or to suffer or permit the same  
to be done upon Owner's real estate of this Village. Violation  
thereof shall subject the Owner or Owners to a fine of not less  
than \$25.00 nor more than \$300.00 for each offense; and each day of  
a continuing offense shall constitute a separate violation.
